

As the cost of gasoline and diesel fuel continues to soar past record highs in Montana, Monica Tranel wants to end fossil fuels and even blamed the fossil fuel industry for aiding in the “destruction of democracy.”

BACKUP:

In May 2022, Montana hit record high fuel prices; the average cost for gasoline is now \$4.92 per gallon:

NOTE: As of July 6, 2022, the average price of gasoline in Montana was \$4.927

- In May 2022, Montana hit record high fuel prices; the average cost for regular fuel was \$4.21 per gallon. “Montana is officially seeing the highest recorded fuel prices at the pump in the state’s history.
