

Josh Riley Helped Convicted Hollywood Rapist Harvey Weinstein Avoid Justice And Continue Preying On Young Women. As Counsel For Crisis Management, Riley And His Law Firm Were Later Exposed By The New York Times For Orchestrating Threats Against Rape Victims Who Came Forward. Weinstein's Lawyers Continue To Be Riley's Largest Group Of Donors For Congress And Have Given Him Over \$230,000 Since 2021.

In 2015, Riley's Boss and Top Campaign Donor David Boies, Delivered a \$10,000 Donation to Manhattan District Attorney Cyrus Vance After Vance Decided Not to Prosecute the Firm's Client, Harvey Weinstein. "Hollywood producer Harvey Weinstein's lawyer delivered \$10,000 to Manhattan District Attorney Cyrus Vance, Jr. in 2015, in the months after Vance's office decided not to prosecute Weinstein over sexual assault allegations, according to an International Business Times review of campaign finance documents. That contribution from attorney David Boies - who previously headlined a fundraiser for Vance - was a fraction of the more than \$182,000 that Boies, his son and his law partners have delivered to the Democrat during his political career." In 2017, Weinstein's Spokesman Said Reports That Riley's Law Partner David Boies Oversaw Weinstein's Spying Operation on His Accusers Was a 'Wild Conspiracy Theory.' "Harvey Weinstein employed private investigators to spy on his accusers and keep tabs on reporters investigating his past, according to a report in the New Yorker. According to the report, Weinstein hired Black Cube, a firm run by former Mossad agents, to collect information on Rose McGowan, who has accused Weinstein of rape. The firm employed undercover agents, one of whom posed as a women's rights activist, to meet with McGowan and obtain information on her forthcoming book, the story states. Weinstein employed Black Cube and Kroll, a corporate security firm, in an effort to block stories in the New Yorker and the New York Times detailing decades of allegations of sexual misconduct, according to the New Yorker. The story also highlights the role of David Boies, of the firm of Boies Schiller Flexner LLP, who is said to have overseen much of the spying effort. Running such an investigation through a law firm can make it subject to attorney-client privilege, which would protect it from disclosure in litigation. Boies told the New Yorker that the arrangement was a "mistake." In a statement to the New Yorker, Weinstein spokeswoman Sallie Hofmeister accused the publication of trafficking in "inaccuracies and wild conspiracy theories." According to the story, Black Cube also retained a freelance journalist to contact McGowan and two other women with accusations against Weinstein, as well as reporters working on the story." Boies was part of that effort, according to The New Yorker, and "personally directed" one of the firms, Black Cube, to find information that would stop The Times from publishing its story." - **Riley and Boies' Firm Contracted with the Spy Firms for \$600,000 to Provide Intelligence That Would Completely Stop the Publication of the NY Times Article.** "Boies' firm ultimately owed Black Cube \$600,000 as part of a contract which outlined a project whose main goal was to "provide intelligence which will help the Client's efforts to completely stop the publication of a new negative article in a leading NY newspaper," according to The New Yorker. Sources confirmed to the magazine that the "Client" referred to in the contract was Weinstein and the "leading NY paper" was The Times. After The Times published its investigation

last month, The New Yorker followed up with several new detailed allegations shortly after. In all, nearly 80 women[3] have accused Weinstein of varying degrees of sexual misconduct. Boies admitted that if Weinstein's inappropriate behavior continued past 2015, then he bore some responsibility for it. In November of 2017, the New York Times Fired Riley’s Firm Over Its Conflict of Interest in Working to Kill It’s Harvey Weinstein Story. “The New York Times on Tuesday fired lawyer David Boies' firm after learning it tried to halt the newspaper's investigation into sexual harassment charges against Hollywood mogul Harvey Weinstein while also representing the newspaper on other matters. Boies has disputed the Times' view that his work for Weinstein represented a conflict of interest. Still, he no longer works for Weinstein and said the task he completed for him was a mistake. It represents the fallout from a New Yorker magazine article that reported Weinstein hired investigators to trail women who had accused him of mistreatment, including Rose McGowan and Rosanna Arquette. Journalists pursuing the story, including Jodi Kantor of the Times and Ronan Farrow, author of Tuesday's New Yorker piece, also were investigated. In 2017, Manhattan Prosecutors Subpoenaed Documents From Riley’s Law Firm While Investigating Sexual Assault Allegations. “Manhattan prosecutors investigating sexual assault allegations against Harvey Weinstein have subpoenaed a wide range of records from the producer’s former company, as well as two law firms that represented him or his company, two people with knowledge of the matter said Friday. The subpoenas indicate a significant broadening of the criminal inquiry, which prosecutors and the police made public last week after Vanity Fair reported allegations by the actress Paz de la Huerta that she had been raped by Mr. Weinstein. The prosecutor listed on the subpoenas is Christopher Conroy, the chief of the major economic crimes bureau in the office of the Manhattan district attorney, Cyrus R. Vance Jr., a sign that the investigation is expanding to look for evidence of fraud or other financial crimes by Mr. Weinstein or others. ... The prosecutors also are seeking records from the law firms Morvillo Abramowitz Grand Iason & Anello and Boies Schiller Flexner, the people said. The Morvillo firm represented Mr. Weinstein in connection with accusations in 2015 that he had sexually assaulted an Italian model. Mr. Vance’s office brought no charges in that case, a decision for which he has come under fire. Mr. Vance has said he did not believe his prosecutors could prove that a crime occurred, while police officials have said an arrest should have been made. Boies Schiller Flexner represented the production company, The Weinstein Company, in connection with several matters, including signing a contract with an investigative firm that was hired to try to block The New York Times from publishing a news story about Mr. Weinstein’s sexual misconduct with women. David Boies, the chairman of the firm, has said he was aware of four of as many as a dozen settlements with women who had accused Mr. Weinstein of sexual misconduct, and was personally involved with one. Benjamin Brafman, one of Mr. Weinstein’s lawyers, declined to comment. Elkan Abramowitz, a partner at the Morvillo firm who represented Mr. Weinstein in the

Gov. Cuomo Called Off an Investigation Into The Handling of Allegations Against Harvey Weinstein Less Than a Week After Receiving a \$25,000 Check from Riley’s Law Firm. “Governor Andrew Cuomo received a \$25,000 check from a law firm that previously represent Harvey Weinstein less than a week before he called off an investigation into the handling of allegations against the disgraced movie mogul. According to Page Six, Cuomo received the check from Manhattan-based firm Boies Schiller and Flexner on June 20, according to the state Board of Elections website. Cuomo announced in March that he had tasked the New York State Attorney General’s Office with investigating Manhattan DA Cyrus Vance’s decision not to prosecute Weinstein after Italian model Ambra Battilana Gutierrez accused him of groping her at a hotel three years ago. Within a week Cuomo halted the investigation. So I'm not-- because I had nothing to do with it, I don't know that I'm in the best position to speak to it. According to the Police Report, Schiller’s Wife Had Visible Injuries. “According to a Ross Police Department statement obtained by Law360, officers responded to a disturbance at a home in Ross around midnight on Thursday. Police said they spoke with the residents and determined that Schiller had committed an act of domestic violence against his wife, Melissa Siebel Schiller. “The victim had visible injuries that were minor in nature and did not require immediate medical treatment,” the statement said. Schiller was arrested and booked at the Marin County Jail on a charge

of violating California Penal Code Section 273.5(a) PC, which makes it illegal to injure a spouse, cohabitant or fellow parent in an act of domestic violence.
