Min Voted For Prohibiting Unpaid Restitution From Blocking An Individual From Clearing Their Record

In 2022, The California Legislature Passed Senate Bill 1106, Which Prohibited Unpaid Restitution From Preventing An Individual From Clearing Their Record. “This bill provides that an unfulfilled order of restitution or a restitution fine shall not be grounds for: (1) denial of a petition for specified expungement relief; (2) denial of release on parole to another state; or (3) denial of a petition for reduction of a conviction.” (SB 1106, [Senate Floor Analysis](#), 8/10/22)

Min Voted In Favor Of Legislation That Would Require “Zero Dollar Bail For All Misdemeanor And Felony Offenses” In Most Cases

In 2021, Min Voted In Favor Of Legislation That Would Require “Zero Dollar Bail For All Misdemeanor And Felony Offenses” In Most Cases. “This bill requires zero dollar bail for all misdemeanor and felony offenses, except as specified, and requires Judicial Council to prepare, adopt, and annually revise a bail schedule for the exempt crimes and for release on new charges while current charges are pending.” (SB 262, [California Legislature](#), Amended 5/20/21)
