"Utilization of Opioid Settlement Funds The Bucks County Commissioners have voted unanimously to commit funds to efforts that cover a full range of services, including Prevention, Treatment, and Recovery Supports, in accordance with Exhibit E." - **The Grant Program Application States That Grants Are For Organizations To "Address The Detrimental Effects Of The Opioid/Overdose Crisis Currently Experienced In Bucks County..."** "To ensure that community-based organizations have the opportunity to make an impact on the community and opioid related issues, the Bucks County Drug & Alcohol Commission, Inc, is offering community mini-grant opportunities. This mini-grant program is available to agencies and organizations that focus on advocacy, prevention, faith-based support, support for people in recovery, or community services. Mini-grants are available to Bucks County organizations to address the detrimental effects of the opioid/overdose crisis currently experienced in Bucks County and to help protect the community from such adverse effects." 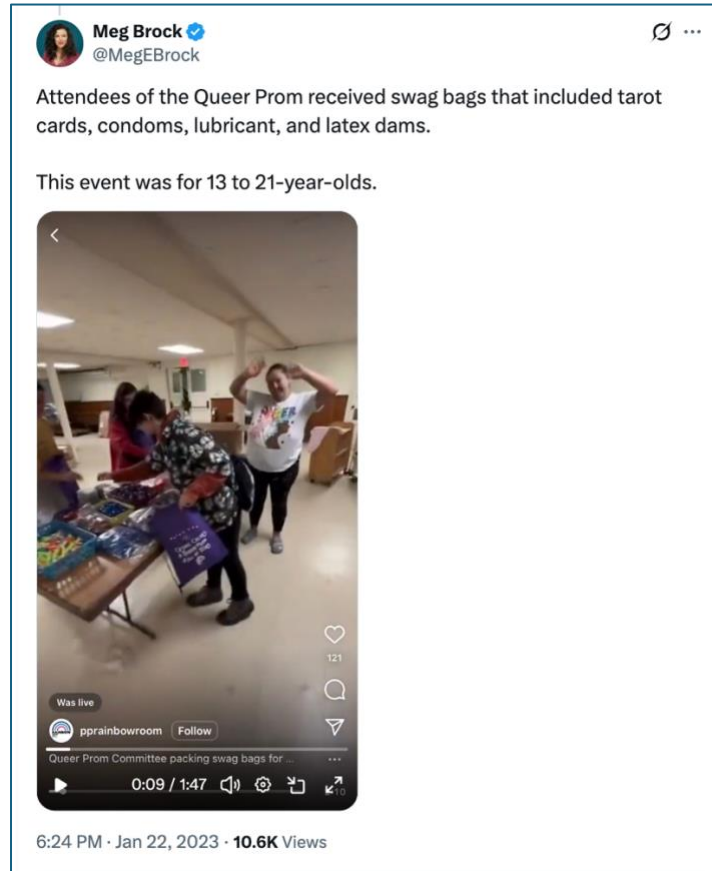
...And Instead Spent It To Fund A Group That Hosted A Party Where They Handed Out Condoms And Lubrication To Children As Young As 14

The Funding Was Set To Transport Youth To The Rainbow Room, Which Hosts Children As Young As 12, Which Once Held A "Queer Prom" Where Condoms And Lubrication Were Handed Out In Gift Bags

The Funding Was Appropriated To Transport Students From Local High Schools To The Rainbow Room, Which Is "Free And Open To Anyone Aged 14 To 21." "The rides are for students at Pennsbury, Truman, and Neshaminy high schools. Parents must sign a consent form. The new location is in Langhorne, while the Rainbow Room has its main headquarters at a church in Doylestown. According to its website, the Rainbow Room programs are 'free and open to anyone ages 14 to 21. Plus, we just brought a new group into our program. Roy G. The Rainbow Room Took Criticism For Holding A "Queer Prom" That Included "Gift Bags With Condoms, Dental Dams, And Lubrication" That Were Handed Out To 14 To 21 Year Olds. "Santarsiero said his youngest son had participated in Rainbow Room programs. The Rainbow Room made headlines when it held a queer prom where gift bags with condoms, dental dams, and lubrication were handed out to participants ages 14 to 21." Additionally, In May 2024, The Rainbow Room Hosted A “SEX ED NIGHT” That Focused On Masturbation, Which Was Held For 14-21 Year Olds. “Rainbow Room functions include seminars like "SEX ED NIGHT / MASTURBATION," which the center held in May 2024. A pamphlet advertising the event shows a photo of a woman’s hand massaging a watermelon designed to represent the female anatomy.
