In July 2026, Dalton Said That He “Will Vote No On The Governor’s Proposal To Slash Property Taxes.” CLICKORLANDO: “Will you vote YES or NO on the constitutional amendment to slash property taxes, and explain your position. How would you replace lost revenue – fees and/or service reductions?” DALTON: “I will vote no on the governor’s proposal to slash property taxes. While I support tax relief for working families, this proposal would imperil our ability to fund public safety, maintain our roads, and prepare for storms. The Proposal Would Increase The Homestead Exemption For Florida Families From \$50,000 To \$250,000 By 2028. “Florida lawmakers on Tuesday approved a sweeping property tax relief proposal backed by Gov. Ron DeSantis, sending a constitutional amendment to the November ballot that would dramatically expand homestead exemptions while shielding school district funding from the plan's impact...
